Martin Luther once said, "The gospel is like fresh, mild and cool air in the extreme heat of summer, a solace and comfort in the anguish of the conscience."

During this Pentecost season, we often reflect upon the Holy Spirit as Fire, Water or Wind. Fire can gently warm, or has the destructive power of a disastrous forest fire. Water can clean and refresh, but it can also flood and drown. Wind can be gently soothing, but when it comes in the form of a tornado or derecho, it can be frightening!

The apostle Paul in 1 Thessalonians 5 exhorts his readers to "*not quench the Spirit*." For insurance purposes, most churches would definitely not want problems with fire, wind or water! But it is my prayer that the fire, wind and water of the Holy Spirit may truly burn, blow and flood FUPC!



The history of Father's Day goes back to 1908, when a church in West Virginia held a sermon to honor

362 men who had been killed the previous year in a coal mining explosion. This was the country's firstever event to strictly honor fathers, but it was just a one-time thing.

The following year, a woman named Sonora Smart Dodd started her quest to establish Father's Day as a national holiday. Dodd was one of six children raised by their single father, and she thought fathers should be honored in the same way as mothers.

After she'd petitioned her local community and government for a year, Dodd's home state of Washington celebrated its first official Father's Day on June 19, 1910. Over the years, the celebration of Father's Day spread from state to state, and after a long fight, it was finally declared a national holiday in 1972, when President Richard Nixon signed it into law.

Father's Day is a holiday that celebrates and honors fathers and their influence in our lives. So no matter whether you celebrate your biological dad, adoptive dad, step-dad, grandpa, or someone who's been like a father to you, the key is to spend time together and participate in activities that show love and appreciation. Start the day off right by bringing Dad to church on June 15!
